

#BlackLivesMatter is a global (United States, UK, and Canada) grassroots organization formed in 2013 in response to the current and historical race-based hatred and discrimination of Black bodies throughout the world. Its mission is to dismantle and eradicate the system of white supremacy and address the violence, subjugation, and political strife inflicted on Blacks across the diaspora. In addition, the Black Lives Matter movement seeks to reimagine the local and global Black community, by creating space for imagination, innovation, with a central focus on Black liberation. Simply put, Black lives are in danger and have been since the installation of chattel slavery. The very concept of Blackness has been beset with negative connotations for countless generations, and this conception continues to perpetuate the cycle of violence and discrimination we see manifesting throughout the United States.

An entity that seeks to create opportunities for advancement, equal rights, and equal treatment of Blacks

A movement to recreate the concept of Blackness and implement intentional spaces for Black empowerment
